Promotes child well-being and prevents child abuse and neglect of children in the Roanoke Valley through education and family support.

3525 children learned how to protect their bodies from sexual abuse.

349 adults learned how to keep children safe as a steward of children.

341 home visits were made to families, with high risk markers of potential abuse, by trained support workers.

90% of prenatal mothers receiving home visits were up-to-date on prenatal visits.



Provides children with a safe place to share their experiences in their own words with experts who will listen to them, protect them, and help them heal.



CHILDREN'S
ADVOCACY CENTER

454 children were able to talk about their abuse in a safe child centered place.

386 families received support services from the family advocacy program.

100% of the multi-disciplinary team members that collaborate with the CAC reported the forensic interview enhanced their ability to gather information.

100% of caregivers in the family reported feeling supported by CAC staff.

100% of caregivers reported their child felt comfortable at the CAC.



Strives to ensure every abused and neglected child in the Roanoke Valley can be safe, have a permanent home, and have the opportunity to thrive through volunteer advocacy.

15 new CASA volunteers were trained with a total roster of 47 active CASA volunteers.

147 children received services to help facilitate finding a permanent home.

99% of children had a permanency plan approved by the court 11 months from dispositional hearing.

96% of CASA volunteer recommendations were adopted into court orders.

Provides the community with innovative, affordable and cooperative ways to resolve differences and transform relationships.

239 families negotiated for custody, visitation, and child support.

91% of divorcing parents reached an agreement in mediation and did not need to return to court.
