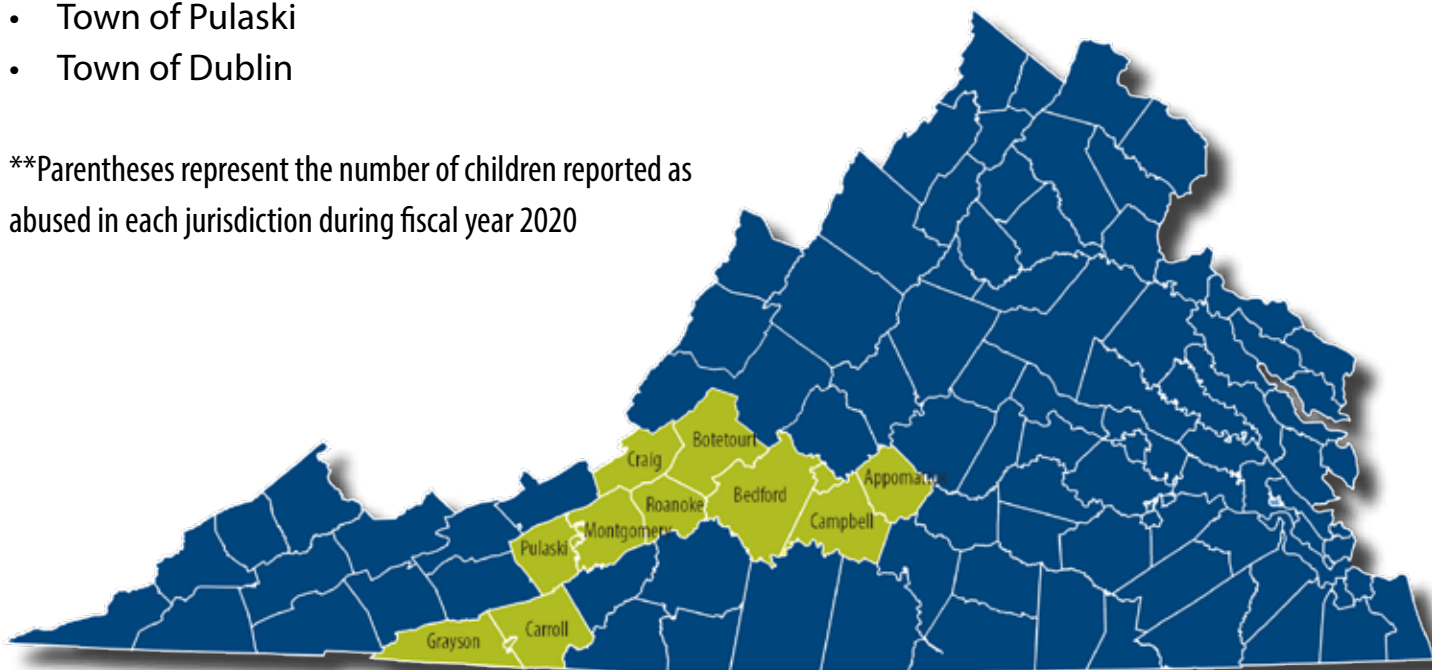

As the air chills and the trees surround us with glorious colors it's hard to believe the world as we knew it turned upside down eighteen months ago and yet we are here, protecting and advocating for abused and neglected children. During this time we had to cancel events, move to remote work, opened a new Children's Advocacy Center in Carroll County, moved our Administration office from the Jefferson Center to Roanoke County, hired a Trauma Informed Specialist, conducted client visits on porches and in parks and entered the world of ZOOM.

Child abuse and neglect did not stop, it increased. The pandemic challenged us in ways we never thought possible, but through it all our team's compass was set in one direction—protect the children. You will see in our Program Data reports we did just that—continued to serve and protect.

If you step into our Children's Advocacy Center in Bedford you will notice painted handprints from floor to ceiling on the walls. Those are the handprints of children who have come to our center to be interviewed and examined because there is an active investigation of child abuse. It is the tiny purple handprint close to floor that always draws my eye. Too tiny, too helpless, will you help us give these children safety, hope and happiness?

I am grateful for our partners, donors, and volunteers for their support during a year like no other.

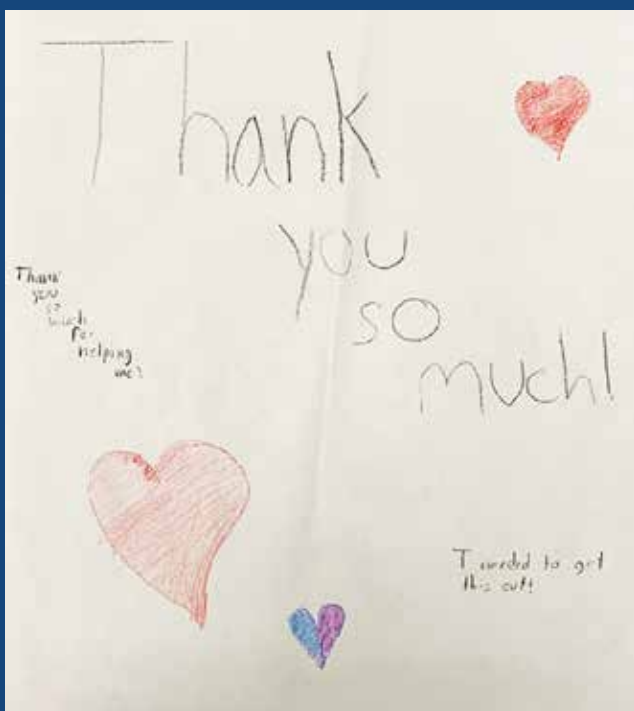

CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER

This fiscal year the CAC saw an increase in referrals for forensic interviews from the Department of Social Services and law enforcement. The CAC conducted 547 forensic interviews of children and served 427 non-offending caregivers through our Family Advocates. These cases came from 27 different localities that feed into our CAC locations in Roanoke, Bedford, the New River Valley and the Twin Counties.

As a long term supporter of CAC services, the Bedford Community Health Foundation has provided funding crucial to the programs ability to offer forensic interviewing and family advocacy services for Bedford families. From the early development of services in the Bedford area, to the establishment of a Bedford CAC office, the Bedford Community Foundation has contributed toward our ability to offer consistent and quality services for children and families in need.



Twin County Community Foundation
Serving Carroll County, Grayson County and the City of Galax

This year the Twin County Community Foundation awarded us a grant that enabled a Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) location to be established within the Twin County community at the local Joy Ranch facility. Having this Center within the Twin County Community allowed the CAC to offer services locally so that families would not have to travel to the New River Valley office.

From a CASA volunteer:

"My volunteer work as a Court Appointed Special Advocate is both fulfilling and challenging at the same time. I serve as an advocate for the best interests of a child who has experienced neglect and abuse. I enjoy learning about the child's circumstances, monitoring the progress of the case through Juvenile and Domestic Relations Court, and reporting to the judge my assessment of what is best for the child. What I've learned in 8 years as a CASA is it takes the combined efforts of lots of caring people to help children get through these very trying circumstances."

CASA of Children's Trust served 152 children this year. CASA currently has 55 active volunteers who provided a total of 3,353 case hours; a non-profit volunteer value of over \$95,000. A total of 13 new volunteers were trained in 2020.

Roanoke Women's Foundation provided funding for CASA to hire an additional part time staff position to serve an increased number of referrals received from Juvenile & Domestic Relations Court in Botetourt and Craig Counties. This position has allowed CASA to increase awareness and visibility to allied professionals and provide advocacy services to children in Botetourt and Craig Counties.



Healthy Families began serving families in Roanoke in 2017. This year 5 families graduated the program when their children turned 3 years old.

Healthy Families home visitors completed 315 home visits, serving 54 families.

The Home Visiting Program is free to any parent who needs help adjusting to the needs of a new baby. Healthy Families participation is correlated with healthier birth rates, lower complications, and reductions in child neglect and abuse.

Through its efforts to address the broad needs of children from prenatal care through the age of five, the Roanoke Valley Children's Fund was a natural fit to support the Healthy Families program. Funding supported weekly home visitation offered to new or expecting parents to help ensure the health and development of both mother and baby.



This year Healthy Families was promoted by signs in and on Valley Metro buses in Roanoke. The project was supported by the Virginia Department of Social Services and the VDSS Community Based Child Abuse Prevention Program.

Since most schools were closed to visitors in 2020/21 many school counselors were relieved to have the Childhelp® **Speak Up Be Safe** in-school child abuse prevention curriculum available by video (thanks to BOSS Motion Picture Co.) or virtual platform. Facilitator Donna Britt taught and interacted with students from a small studio in her basement with the help of school counselors. We taught almost 2,000 students with these methods. Some schools offered the videos to every grade, which we rarely are able to do with one SUBS facilitator.

From the Director of Development:

When I came on board with Children's Trust in September 2020 after a fundraising hiatus due to COVID, I wasn't sure what to expect. I knew our programs had been working in creative ways to continue serving the children and families that needed us most. 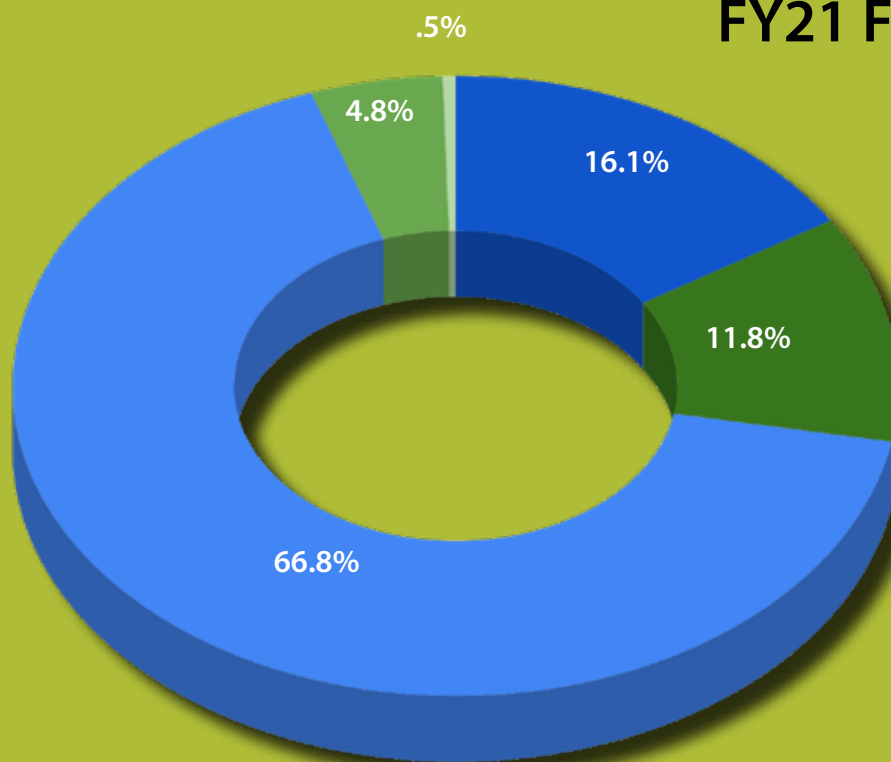
